Rory McGann (CLARE)

When did you start refereeing? Club Referee since 2004, appointed to Munster Provincial Panel in 2013 and National Referee Panel in 2016.

What finals (club or county) have you refereed? A member of the Newmarket on Fergus GAA Club, Rory has garnered experience in a number of roles on both the provincial and national stages. Some appointments of note include the Munster Junior Club Final 2015, Munster Minor Final 2016, Munster Intermediate Club Final 2016, Munster U21 Final 2017, Munster Senior Club Final 2017, All Ireland Minor Semi Final in Croke Park in 2018, and Allianz Hurling League Div. 2 Final in 2019. Rory was also appointed to the All-Ireland Championship Panel in 2019 and in 2020 he had the privilege of refereeing his second Clare County Championship Final.

What advice would you have for any aspiring referee?

Familiarise yourself with the rules by enrolling in a referee training course, get some reliable lads to help you out with umpiring and give it a go ... a good team is half the battle!

Describe your funniest moment to date as a referee?

Umpire at a local club game slides down from his vantage point at back of goal, collects the white flag en route, dusts himself off and coolly waves for a point.

If you could change one rule in hurling, what would it be? If recent football activity has taught us anything, it is that the 'black card' is seemingly ineffective when a game is in the melting pot during the closing minutes. Rather than a 'black card' in hurling as is currently being mooted, the awarding of a penalty for any cynical foul within a set distance from goal may prove a more meaningful deterrent. It may also prove more manageable at club level.

Any other business? Rory is married to Theresa and they have 4 budding camogie stars – Áine, Aoife, Aisling & Aoibhinn. Rory would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who kindly assisted with his various fixtures in 2020.

CAN LIMERICK MAKE HOME ADVANTAGE COUNT?

Nearly eight weeks after the competition started, the Munster Under 20 Hurling Championship recommences here this evening with the meeting of Limerick and Cork. The Rebels have the advantage of a competitive fixture, a 2-24 to 2-10 away victory over Kerry though how useful that particular run-out will be is debatable given the 54 days which have elapsed since.

Cork have been strong at the underage grades in the Province in recent years, contesting the last three Provincial Finals at this grade (Under 21 - 2017 and 2018 and Under 20 - 2019). Allied to that, their successes in winning the Munster and All-Ireland Under 17 titles and the Munster title at Under 18 level in 2017 gives them a significant crop of players to choose from. Four of the players who started the 2019 Munster Under 20 Hurling Final (Conor O'Callaghan, Eoin Roche, Tommy O'Connell and Shane O'Regan) remained on the starting line-up for that Kerry game in the Quarter-Final last October.

Limerick's team on the other hand will include four of the extended panel who will take on Waterford in tomorrow's All-Ireland Senior Hurling Final - Jason Gillane, Josh Considine, Brian O'Grady and Mark Quinlan. The Shannonsiders have contested six of the last seven Munster Minor Hurling Finals, winning three titles which demonstrates a consistency of talented players coming through their underage ranks - something which has served them well already at Senior level.

Home advantage has also been very important in this fixture over the years when the grade was Under 21 as opposed to Under 20. The counties last met at Under 21 level in the 2017 Munster Final when Limerick managed a two-point victory over Cork en route to All-Ireland success. Sean Finn, Kyle Hayes, Aaron Gillane, Cian Lynch, Peter Casey, Tom Morrissey and Barry Nash all started that Munster Final and will line out for Limerick Seniors tomorrow. In fact, you have to go back to 1999 to find the last time a Cork Under 21 Hurling team came to a Limerick venue and secured victory, on that occasion a win in a Quarter-Final played at Bruff. Today's winners will play Tipperary or Waterford in the Munster Final fixed for Wednesday December 23rd.

In the curtain-raiser this afternoon, the Munster Minor Football Championships gets underway some eight months later than planned when Limerick host Waterford. The counties met in the Minor Round-Robin series in 2019 played at Fraher Field Dungarvan and the game finished in a draw. When the sides last met in the Minor grade (then Under 18) at the LIT Gaelic Grounds in 2017, Limerick ran out winners by 1-10 to 0-9 after a late Calvin Moran goal ensured victory. A similarly close affair can be expected here today if recent results in this grade are an accurate indicator. The winners will take on Tipperary or Clare in the Munster Semi-Final next Wednesday night. Enjoy the games.

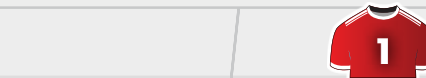

EXTRA TIME AND FINISHING GAMES ON THE DAY

All games in the 2020 Bord Gáis Energy Munster GAA Hurling Under 20 Championship and 2020 Electric Ireland Munster GAA Football Minor Championship that finish level after normal playing times should be completed as per the GAA Ard Chomhairle Regulations approved on the 19th January 2019 and in accordance with Rules of Specification 3.4. & 3.6 T.O. Part 2 2019, that relevant games that finish level after normal playing times should be completed as follows -

PHASE 1

- Proceed to Extra time as provided for in T.O. Cuid II (two periods of ten minutes each way)

PHASE 2 (Penalty Kicks/Pucks)

If still level, a "penalty competition" to decide the outcome:

- The relevant rules in T.O. Cuid II shall apply in relation to Penalty Kicks/Pucks, unless otherwise stated.
- Penalties will be taken for goals only.
- The Referee shall choose the end at which the penalty kicks/pucks will be taken. The end may be changed by the referee if it becomes unplayable during the course of the penalties.
- If a penalty is scored, the goal umpire, will wave the green flag once the referee has signalled.
- If the penalty is saved or missed the point umpire will signal a wide once the referee has signalled.
- Each team shall register five penalty takers, a goal keeper & a substitute goal keeper with the referee and indicate in which order the penalty takers will take their penalties. (A penalty taker can also be a goalkeeper or a substitute goalkeeper.)
- Only players who are on the field of play at the end of Phase 1 (i.e. end of Extra Time), shall be allowed to be registered as a penalty taker or goalkeeper. Exception: The substitute goalkeeper can come from the team panel.
- Subject to the conditions below both teams will take five penalty kicks/pucks which are taken alternately by the teams. The game is awarded to whichever team scores more of their five penalty kicks/pucks.
 - If, before both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks, one team has scored more goals than the other team could score, even if they were to complete their five penalty kicks/pucks, no more penalty kicks/pucks shall be taken.
 - If, after both teams have taken five penalty kicks/pucks and both teams have scored the same number of goals, the penalty competition will continue but in sudden death format using the same five registered players until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks/pucks.
 - In sudden death, the same sequence of penalty takers does not have to be followed as in the first round of penalty kicks/pucks.
 - Each penalty kick/puck is taken by a different player. All registered players must take a penalty kick/puck before any player can take an additional penalty kick/puck.
