2024 Wheelchair Hurling & Camogie **DEVELOPMENT DAY**

The GAA hosted a Wheelchair Hurling and Camogie Development Day on April 6th 2024 at Croke Park.

The Development Day featured a series of workshops and training led by experienced coaches and players in wheelchair hurling and camogie. Participants had the chance to learn new High performance techniques and engage in educational workshops in a supportive and inclusive environment.

This event marked a significant step forward in promoting inclusivity and accessibility in sports, offering individuals with disabilities an opportunity to engage in the exhilarating and traditional Irish sports of hurling and camogie.

Wheelchair hurling and camogie are adaptive versions of the traditional Gaelic games, modified to accommodate athletes with physical disabilities. This initiative seeks to break down barriers and provide a platform for individuals of all abilities to participate in these beloved sports.

The Development Day helped to raise awareness about the importance of adaptive sports and promote social inclusion for individuals with disabilities. By fostering a welcoming and accessible environment, organizers hope to inspire more people to get involved in wheelchair hurling and camogie and break down stereotypes surrounding disability and sports.

Q1What is Wheelchair Hurling / Camogie?

AnswerGround hurling, played by Wheelchair users.

Q2How old is the sport?

AnswerWheelchair Hurling / Camogie was 'invented' in 1998 in a Dublin Special Needs school, by school Principal, Tim Maher.

Q3How many players are involved?

AnswerTeams are 6 a side, made up of: 2 Forwards,
1 Midfielder, 2 Backs and 1 Goal keeper.

Q4Does the game have zones?

AnswerYes, there are three zones.

1. Attackers and Defenders must stay in their appropriate zones.
2. Midfielders can travel in both the attacking and defensive zones.
3. The Goal keepers are the only players allowed in the goal keeping zones.
